More than 40 information visits on the Quebec territory for the Québec Inquiry Commission

Val-d'Or, October 25, 2017 – The Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec: listening, reconciliation and progress is pleased to unveil a first report of its visits. As of today, 41 meetings and information sessions have been performed across the province of Québec both in Indigenous communities and organizations.

Many public information sessions have been performed in most Native Friendship Centres, organizations situated in urban areas and in different communities on Anishinabe, Atikamekw, Cree, Hurons-Wendat, Innu and Mohawk territories.

More visits to come

Representatives from the Québec Inquiry will continue its visits in the months on Anishinabe, Abenakis, Eeyou Istchee, Innu and Mohawk territories.

The Aboriginal relations team continues its outreach with different Indigenous representatives to organize new information sessions in the months to come. The Quebec Inquiry emphasizes that everyone is welcome to request an information session whether it is a nation, a community, an organisation or a citizen.
