**Representatives of the provincial Public Inquiry Commission
will visit the Algonquin community of Kitigan Zibi Anishinabeg
to offer public information sessions**

Val-d'Or, August 1, 2017 – Representatives of the provincial Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec: listening, reconciliation and progress will soon be in the Algonquin community of Kitigan Zibi Anishinabeg to meet with members during public information sessions. These community visits will take place during the week of August 6.

Sunday, August 6 : The information session will be held during the annual meeting of the Algonquin Anishinabeg Nation Tribal Council from 9:00 am at the community hall, located at 311 Fafard Street, Maniwaki.

Wednesday, August 9 : The information session will be held from 10:00 am at the Kitigan Zibi Cultural Education Center, located at 54 Makwa Mikan, Kitigan Zibi, for members of the Kitigan Zibi Anishinabeg community and the Maniwaki Native Friendship Center.

These public information sessions are intended to provide information on the mandate of the Commission and to allow representatives to answer questions from members of the community. The Commission's team will be comprised of representatives from the judicial team, the Aboriginal relations team, the support and wellness team and the investigative team. They will be able to meet with people in person who wish to share their stories with the Commission.
