New public information sessions will be held in the Côte-Nord region and in Nunavik

Val-d'Or, February 15, 2018 – Representatives from the Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec: listening, reconciliation and progress will visit Pakua Shipi, Unamen Shipu and Kuujjuaq in February to offer information sessions and hold several meetings.

Pakua Shipi

February 19: The public information session will be held in collaboration with the community of Pakua Shipi at 1:00 PM, at the community hall of the Health Center.

February 21: Members of the Commission will also participate to the Mamit Innuat Tribal Council that will take place at the Pakua Shipi school gymnasium.

Unamen Shipu

February 22: The public information session will be held in collaboration with the community of Unamen Shipu, commencing at 1:00 PM at the school gymnasium.

Kuujjuaq

February 27: Commission representatives will take part in the Kativik Regional Government (KRG) regional Council in Kuujjuaq to present its mandate and schedule future information sessions throughout Nunavik.

Meet with members of the Commission

During these meetings, community members will be able to meet with the Commission's employees, ask general questions on how the public hearings will take place, express general concerns about the Commission and share information with the CERP's team. Investigation agents will be available during this time to meet with people in person who wish to share their stories related to one of the six (6) public services included in the mandate of the Commission.
