In collaboration with the Abitibiwinni First Nation Council, the presentation will take place on Tuesday, September 5, from 9 :00 am at the community hall, in Pikogan.

During this meeting, the community members will be able to meet with the Commission's employees, ask general questions on how the public hearings will take place, express general concerns about the Commission and share information with the CERP's team. Investigation agents will be available during this time to meet with people in person who wish to share their stories related to one of the six (6) public services included in the mandate of the Commission.
