### The Québec Public Inquiry continues its visits within communities

**Val-d'Or, October 12, 2017** – Representatives from the Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec: listening, reconciliation and progress will be in the Innu community of Mashteuiatsh and in the Atikamekw community of Opitciwan on October 16 and 18, to offer public information sessions.

#### **Community of Mashteuiatsh**

The presentation will be held in collaboration with the Pekuakamiulnuatsh Takuhikan organization, on Monday, October 16, from 6:30 pm, at the agora of Musée amérindien de Mashteuiatsh, located at 1787 Amishk street.

#### **Community of Opitciwan**

The presentation will be held in collaboration with the Atikamekw Council of Opitciwan, on Wednesday, October 18, at 1:00 pm, at Mamu room.

#### **Meet with the members of the Commission**

During these meetings, people will be able to meet with the Commission's employees, ask general questions on how the public hearings will take place, express general concerns about the Commission and share information with the CERP's team. Two Investigation agents will be available during this time to meet with people in person who wish to share their stories related to one of the six (6) public services included in the mandate of the Commission.
