**Me Suzanne Arpin appointed Chief Counsel and spokesperson  
of the Québec Inquiry Commission**

**Val-d'Or, September 6, 2018** - The Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec: listening, reconciliation and progress announces the resignation of Me Christian Leblanc and Me Marie-Josée Barry-Gosselin. They will officially leave their respective functions on Friday, September 7th. Suzanne Arpin will be appointed Chief Counsel of the Commission as of Monday, September 10, 2018.

Me Arpin, who joined the Commission in 2017, has worked primarily in the areas of youth protection, adoption, youth criminal justice, and health and social services law.

She will continue to assume her current responsibilities in addition to serving as Chief Counsel and spokesperson.

The Commission would like to sincerely thank Me Leblanc and Me Barry-Gosselin for their contribution to the work of the Public Inquiry Commission and wish them continued success in their careers.
