## **The Québec Public Inquiry to visit Nunavik and Mi'gmaq territories in July**

**Val-d'Or, June 27, 2018** – Representatives from the Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec: listening, reconciliation and progress will travel to Nunavik and Mi'gmaq territories in July, in order to offer public information sessions.

So far, the Commission has visited 9 of the 11 Indigenous nations and more than 250 presentations have been performed in Aboriginal communities and organizations around the Province of Québec.

### Calendar of the visits :

#### **Gesgapegiag**

July 3: The public information session will be held in collaboration with the community of Gesgapegiag, from 5 to 7 PM, at the Galgoasiet Natural Resources Building.

#### **Listuguj**

July 5: The public presentation will be held in collaboration with the community of Listuguj, starting at 6 :00 PM (AST), at the Bingo Hall.

#### **Kangiqsualujjuaq**

Commission representatives will be in the village of Kangiqsualujjuaq from July 4 to 6.

#### **Kuujjuaq**

Public presentations will take place in Kuujjuaq from July 8 to 13.

#### **Puvirnituaq**

Information sessions will be held from July 23 to 27.

### **Meet with members of the Commission**

During these public information sessions, individuals will be able to meet with the Commission's employees, ask general questions on how the public hearings will take place, express general concerns about the Commission and share information with the CERP's team. Investigation agents will be available during this time to meet with people who wish to share their stories related to one of the six (6) public services included in the mandate of the Commission.

### **Deadline for opening news files**

The deadline for opening news files has been set for September 5, 2018. The investigation agents will not be accepting new testimonies after this date. However, any testimonies received before September 5 will be analysed and treated by the Commission.
