

## Statutory Declaration

I do solemnly declare that,

[REDACTED] Yes I was beaten up by a lady. She was starting out of nowhere and I tried to defend myself, going on the top of because she was fighting to much. The police arrived and they took me instead because I was on the top of her and she bit my arm. The police did not asked what is going on and they just took me and sent me to jail for one (1) night. They did not brought me to the clinic station because my arm was bleeding and the lady bit me and took skin from my arm. I lost flesh.

EM: Do you remember the year of the event?

[REDACTED] It was in my community in [REDACTED] It was during [REDACTED] during the summer.

EM: Do you remember who the police officer was?

[REDACTED] No, they keep changing the police.

EM: What happened after you were arrested?

[REDACTED] I was arrested and the lady has not been arrested even if she started all this fight. I asked the police to send me to the nursing station because I was bleeding and hurting on my arm and the flesh was open. The day after they release me and they told me to go home.

EM: Did they charge you?

[REDACTED] No, they said I was only there to sober up.

EM: Did they offer you the chance to talk to a lawyer?

EM: So if I understand, you were not aware that you were there only to sober up?

■ Exact. I remember that the police officers did not want to bring to the nursing station even if I showed my arm. They just ignored me like I was nobody.

EM: Is it the first that something like that happened with the police?

■ No, almost six (6) years ago, I was beaten up really bad out of nowhere by a lady when I was smoking outside. She came because I had two glasses of Smirnoff that day. It was in June. She attacked me out of nowhere and she beaten me up. I was Medevac in Puvirnituk and after in Montreal and nobody was recognized me because it was swollen. The lady that I charged, they only took her for (1) day. The situation happened in Umiujaq but the police came to the Puvirnituk hospital and asked me what happened and I charged her. The next day, the woman was out of jail and Me I was in Montreal. I was in Montreal for two (2) or three (3) weeks for my broken skull.

They let me sign four (4) or five (5) papers from IVAC for my broken skull and they asked me how many children I have and I still waiting results.

EM: Did they informed you about what happened with this lady?

■ NO, she only said that this lady cannot be around me that it is. But I was surprised that she was arrested only for one (1) night. For almost murdering me and braking my skull. I have nothing against her whatsoever she is a stranger to me.

EM: Were you scared of her after that?

■ Yes, I was scared to come back in Umiujaq after, I was thinking about staying in Kuujjuaraapik after that. I did not go home almost three (3) months.

About Youth protection, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED], when he was 15 years old, he just came back from group home in Puvirnituk last year. Without our consent, he got arrested, the police officers did not informed us or the DYP.

EM: You told me earlier that he did a suicide attempt, is it right?

■ No it is not true. There was a witness. There is a lady, she was arrested and she is over twenty (20). She saw it and she heard everything.

EM: And he received a needles?

■ Yes, I have pictures. They said that he was suicidal and he puts a lots of needles everywhere on his body. They said that they called the DYP to inform them about his situation. They tried to trick us, something like that. The lady who was arrested said that it was not true. She was there, listening and she was watching.

EM: During that time he was in Group home at Puvirnituk?

■ No, he was in Group home in Salluit but when he came back at home in my place in ■ He was arrested that night because he had conditions not to be out after ten (10) o'clock. The situation happened inside the police station and they lied to us that he was suicidal. He was fifteen (15) years old at that time. I remember that I was saying to myself what is going on. They even send him in a rehabilitation centre in Montreal. He was only driving around his two (2) wheelers.

EM: If I understand, it is the police intervention that made the behaviours problems of ■, is it right? He started panicking?

■ But he did not have to do that, giving him all the needles and the fact that he lied to us. ■ told us and to the DYP that he was not suicidal. The police woman kept saying that he had conditions and I did not want to talk to her.

EM: You are mad because the police did not try to find you, informed you about ■'s situation?

■ Yes, he was arrested the all week-end before he left for Montreal and I did not like that, he was only fifteen (15) years old. Who would be arrested underage for the whole week-end. That is it not right and I know my rights. When I visited him and saw what happened, I took pictures of the needles and I keep it at home.

EM: Do you have others situations that you would like to share?

■ No, that's all.
