[c] Reporting of data by Type of Care may be inaccurate during the early 1980's due to limited billing information. Consequently, data may be reported as an aggregate under Institutional Care.

[d] Manitoba's data for the period 1988-89 to 1990-91 contains estimated care days under the Mendosha/Rawson Agreement for Off-Reserve Indian Children in Care. Effective April 1, 1991, DIAND ceased making payments under this Agreement in order to fund ICFS developmental activities (and in recognition that DIAND had no authority to enter into the Agreement in the first place).

[e] 1994-95 to 1998-99 Data: the Ontario Region was unable to obtain complete CFS data from the Ontario Provincial Government, therefore, ESTIMATED care days were applied.

[f] Addition of new element "in-Home" in the Atlantic CFS forms only. Authority to continue to fund services to children in their own home is unique to Atlantic. The costs and data had to be segregated from regular maintenance because this is essential information in the developing of a new formula.

[h] The <<average number of children in care>> is calculated by dividing 365 into the <<Total Number of Care Days>>

[g] 2010-2011. Only one recipient in Yukon region required to provide this data; however, the DCI was not a requirement of the agreement, rather, Government of Yukon is required to provide monthly invoices. In 2010-2011 none of these invoices have been received.

[i] 2011-2012. Yukon did not received yet the report from Gov. of Yukon.

Definition:

Foster Care: refers to care provided in a family setting by persons who are not the parents of the child and where placement was made by an agency such as a Band, DIAND, or a Provincial Child Welfare authority.

Group Homes: refer to care provided to a small group of 5 to 10 children in a setting where normally the permanent full-time staff is a couple operating in a setting which provides a family atmosphere.

Institutional Care: refers to care provided in a setting where one or more groups of children occupy the premises and permanent full-time staff who work on a shift basis. It may provide care and treatment for children with emotional problems.
